Standardised Training

The UK government benchmarks for safe and competence practice are set out in National Occupational Standards (NOS) for a range of complementary healthcare disciplines.

These standards set out the required:

- knowledge and understanding
- skills to be demonstrated

Training providers use the National Occupational Standards to design and assess training programmes that meet CNHC's requirements





Eligibility to apply

All practitioners who wish to apply to register with CNHC must demonstrate they have met UK government standards and declare that:

- They have current professional indemnity insurance
- They do not have a criminal record and have not been the subject of any disciplinary or civil proceedings
- There are no health issues that would impact their ability to practise
